



Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking Annual Statement 2017

1. Introduction from the Management Team

The Melrob Group Management Team has a zero-tolerance approach to modern slavery and we are committed to acting ethically and with integrity in all of our business dealings and relationships to achieve continuous improvement of our practices and processes to combat modern slavery and human trafficking.

The Melrob Group considers its exposure to the risk of slavery and human trafficking to be relatively limited and has taken steps to ensure that such practices do not take place in its business nor the business of any organisation that supplies goods and/or services to it.

2. Organisational structure

The Melrob Group has its headquarters in the UK with subsidiaries in Europe, USA, Singapore, India, Japan and Korea. The organisation is controlled by a Board of Directors underpinned by local Managing Directors or CEOs. Our activities are focused on the supply and distribution of Specialist Chemicals to a variety of industries. In addition to this we operate a manufacturing facility in Singapore (contact lens raw materials) and a Nutritional Supplements packing operation in the UK. The business is conducted by qualified professionals and is not seasonal in nature.

The labour supplied to the Melrob Group in pursuance of its operations is sourced from all of the regions where we have operating companies as stated above.

3. Our Supply Chains

Apart from some small-volume chemical products for the contact lens industry Melrob is not the manufacturer of the goods we supply. The Melrob Group sources raw materials and distributes products from a diverse base of global manufacturers, and we in turn supply products to a wide range of globally-located customers, using contracted 3rd-party logistics service providers for transport, storage and repacking.

The manufacturers whose goods we supply are mainly global corporations who participate in the United Nations Global Compact (UNGC), whose programme covers various aspects of Corporate Social Responsibility, including labour and slavery. For all other suppliers of goods and services we have a formal supplier approval programme which we use in conjunction with ISO9001 accreditation.

4. Recruitment and Training

The Melrob Group has a Recruitment Policy in place under which we work only with reputable recruitment companies in all regions of operation.

We have notified all Melrob Group employees of their obligations under the Melrob Group Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking Policy and ensure that all new employees are made aware at induction of the Policy and Melrob's commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all of our business dealings and relationships.
